## **A PRIEST'S PONDERINGS**

During the past five months, you might have heard me say, “I’ve had a lot of wonderful adventures and experiences in my life, but none of them compare to parenthood.” This is true. From growing up in the natural splendor of Florida’s National Seashore, to working for human rights in South Africa, to holding private communion with Archbishop Tutu, to following a call into the priesthood and serving among you, I have had a rich diversity of experiences in this wide world. Yet none has so wholly transformed my life as the love I have experienced as a parent.

Of course, parenting also holds its own unique pains. As occurs when one loves deeply, one’s heart breaks easily. Living in South Africa, a society still reeling from decades of political violence, I witnessed people being beaten by police; I stepped over dead bodies in the streets. Yet none of this prepared me for the unique pains of parenting. Who knew how brutal the mundane torture of sleep training would be? And the invention of the video monitor has taken this torture to a whole new level. One can now see the tormented facial expressions that accompany your baby’s endless, unattended cries. And as other parents will tell me, this is only the beginning of the pain that comes from such deep love.

This unique form of torture (sleep training) has entered my life on the heels of Willa’s baptism. And this juxtaposition has given me much fruit for meditation and prayer. As a parent, I found myself surprisingly anxious in the days leading up to Willa’s baptism. It was a curious feeling; for what could be more joyous than a priest presenting her child for baptism? Except, I knew what was coming. I knew that in committing Willa to a life in Christ, we were committing her not only to share in the joy of the resurrection, but also in the torture of the cross.

Of course, the cross is a part of life. We all suffer our own share of mundane torture in one form or another. Despair, disease, loss, loneliness, fear, mental illness, unemployment, broken relationship, meaninglessness, addiction, \_\_\_\_\_. Fill in the blank for yourself. While baptism does not expose us uniquely to life’s suffering, it certainly makes real and tangible this truth about life. Baptism into the cross of Christ makes it impossible for us to bury our heads and deny the truth of life’s pains.

But, as Godly Play<sup>1</sup> would remind us, the cross does not exist apart from the resurrection. THERE IS NO CROSS WITHOUT THE RESURRECTION. Whatever torture life brings, however mundane or extraordinary, it is, already, redeemed. Christ takes every torturous reality into himself on the cross. And he triumphs over this torture through the resurrection. Turning our fear into faith. Reminding us that nothing in this world is absent of the power of God’s redeeming love.

And it is THIS truth, made tangible in the sacrament of baptism, that gives me strength for the many mundane tortures this life may bring. It is this truth that called me to carry my yet innocent child to the waters of death, and resurrection. It is this truth that gives me the courage to affirm the demanding call of baptismal life with the words, “I will, with God’s help.” And it is this truth that comforts me in the crying hours.

**January 9<sup>th</sup>: Epiphany Pageant**

**January 15th: Keeping God's People Safe Training**

I have scheduled a Keeping God's People Safe Training session for Level 1 and Level 2 at Church of the Holy Nativity in Clarendon Hills for January 15, 2011. The training will last from 930-4pm, with Level 1 going from 9:30-11:30 a.m., a 30 minute lunch break, and 12:00-4 p.m. for Level 2. **This is a requirement for anyone who works with children and/or youth and is a useful training to attend.** I will provide snacks and beverages during the day and pizza for lunch. **R.S.V.P. by January 10, 2011.** From the Diocesan website, I found and have posted who is required to attend the different training levels.

**(From the Diocesan website <http://www.episcopalchicago.org/ministries/pastoral-care>)** **KEEPING GOD'S PEOPLE SAFE (KGPS)** abuse prevention training is required for all Clergy, paid employees, those who provide pastoral services, and all persons who work with Children/Youth. This training needs to be renewed, in a group setting, every five years.

- Level I Child Abuse Prevention Training is required of all persons who work - -regularly or occasionally, staff or volunteer, adult or youth-- with Children/Youth.
- Levels I & II training is required of all Clergy, Paid Staff and Church Personnel who administer programs, perform pastoral ministries, serve as Wardens, or are Bishop's Committee /Vestry members.
- Screening Interviews and Background Checks are required for all Clergy and paid employees, without exception.
- Church/Agency Volunteers who regularly work with Children /Youth or Vulnerable Adults, or who have routine access to the facilities and grounds where Children/Youth gather, or who perform pastoral ministries also need to participate in the Screening process.

I think that is all! I wish you all a wonderful new year and cannot wait to see what the 2011 has in store!

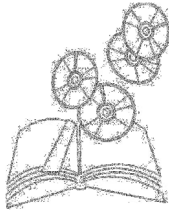

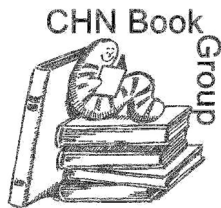

## NEW BOOK ANNOUNCED

The upcoming book for the January meeting (date to be announced) is Acts of Faith: The Story of an American Muslim in the Struggle for the Soul of a Generation by Dr. Eboo Patel. Dr. Patel is a "local boy," having grown up in Glen Ellyn and graduated from Glenbard South High School. After receiving his undergraduate degree from the University of Illinois, he went to Oxford as a Rhodes scholar, where he earned a doctorate in sociology of religion. He is the founder and executive director of the Interfaith Youth Core, an organization that unites young people of different religions to perform community service and explore their common values. Dr. Patel also serves as an advisor about interfaith issues to President Obama and to the Council on Foreign Relations. Among the many media outlets for which he has written are the Washington Post, Chicago Tribune, NPR and the Harvard Divinity School Bulletin. He delivered the keynote address at the Nobel Peace Prize Forum with President Jimmy Carter. All this, and he is only 35 years old!!

In Acts of Faith, Patel tells his own story of an adolescent finding his way as both an American and an Indian who struggled with the religion of his parents—Islam--but then he goes on to show how our youth can be transformed into leaders for pluralism and peace. His book is available in hardcover and paperback, as well as for Kindle. Carol Park will have paperback copies available on the next few Sundays; the price is \$11.20. The January date for discussion will be announced shortly.

## **PRESIDING BISHOP CALLS FOR SEASON OF PRAYER FOR SUDAN**

Calling for a Season of Prayer for Sudan, Episcopal Church Presiding Bishop Katharine Jefferts Schori has issued a letter which details the importance of Sudan and that African country's upcoming referendum on January 9, 2011 and urges three steps – prayer, study, and action.

“As a fellow member of the Anglican Communion, Sudan’s fragile state is a matter for our own concern,” she states. “Many of us know about, and have even met, some of the so-called “Lost Boys” of Sudan, who immigrated to the United States as refugees beginning in 2001. The Episcopal Church now has a number of Sudanese congregations and communities of faith as a result.”

“I want to challenge us as a Church to pray for the people of Sudan, to learn more about the forces driving the violence, and to advocate for a peaceful referendum, and whatever the outcome, a peaceful future,” she charged.

She concludes, “As we approach the season of preparation for the Prince of Peace, we pray that His reign may be made real in Sudan.”

# PRAYERS FOR SUDAN



On January 9, 2011, the people of Southern Sudan will vote on whether or not to form a separate nation. This vote was a condition of the 2005 Comprehensive Peace Agreement, yet the government in the North is mobilizing its forces in anticipation of a vote for separation, and some violence has already broken out. Chicago's companion diocese, The Diocese of Renk, is in the Upper Nile district, and its area forms a peninsula in the northern territory controlled by the government in Khartoum. This geography and the routing of the nation's major north-south highway through the heart of Renk puts the Diocese of Renk in a vulnerable situation. If the vote is for independence, the northern government is expected to evict thousands of southern Sudanese refugees from the Khartoum area, which means Renk could be facing a major humanitarian crisis.

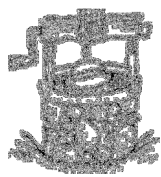

Bishop Lee has requested the Diocese of Chicago congregations provide funding for digging 50 water wells around the world in 2011. His hope is that each congregation will raise \$5,000, the cost of one well, or partner with another congregation sharing the cost of one well. He is calling the project WELL, WELL, WELL. All proceeds will go to Episcopal Relief and Development who is implementing the project. ERD have engineers on the ground, and ensure training and ongoing maintenance of any wells they dig. We began our fundraising for this project at CHN by selling Gift Cards for Christmas gifts. In addition, the Christmas offering and the loose plate offering at the Bishop's recent visit were designated toward this goal. We will continue to sell the gift cards which are \$15 each. 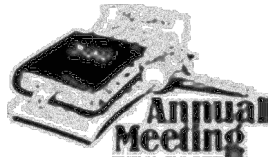
