## ***CAPITAL CAMPAIGN***

The results are in from the 94 households who participated in our feasibility study conducted in April. Here are the key findings which guided the vestry's determination of how to move forward.

1. Your top project priorities were: Universal Accessible Entrance, Pitched Roof Retrofit, Expanded Kitchen and Toilets
2. Based on your giving estimates, our feasibility study shows that \$585,000 can be raised, with additional challenge opportunities available to us
3. A majority of respondents would support prudent long term debt, if needed to ensure completion of these plans

After careful consideration and research, the vestry voted to initiate a capital campaign in the fall of 2011, with the guidance of the Episcopal Church Foundation, to raise the funds needed to accomplish the priorities above. The total cost of achieving these top priorities will be more than \$585,000. The finance committee has researched construction and mortgage options and their potential impact on CHN's operating budget. We are all dedicated to moving forward with these plans without jeopardizing our mission and ministry. In the next few months more information will follow with details of how you can help achieve our common goal.

This is an exciting time for our parish as we assemble our leadership team. When we reach out to you, please remember that "many hands make light work", and joyfully accept this opportunity to serve our community of faith.

Godly Play core training will be offered over three days in August at the University of St. Mary of the Lake in Mundelein: Friday, August 12, 4 pm to 9 pm; Saturday August 13, 8:30 am to 5:30 pm; and Sunday August 14, 8:30 am to 4 pm. Training is sponsored by the Office of Lifelong Christian Formation in partnership with the Godly Play Foundation. Godly Play teaches children the art of using Christian language—parable, sacred story, silence and liturgical action—helping children become more fully aware of the mystery of God’s presence in their lives. Godly Play is about locating each lesson in the whole system of Christian language and involving the creative process to discover the depths of meaning for individuals. Godly Play is about learning how each of the stories of God’s people connects with the child’s own experience and relationship with God. The goal of Godly Play is to show how to be open to the Holy Spirit, the Creator and the Redeemer all at once and all the time in every place. Dinner will be served Friday night, and breakfast and lunch on Saturday and Sunday.

***PADS--Homeless & Hunger Mission***

**PADS UPDATE:** The remaining PADS dates for this summer are: **July 9/10, Aug. 13/14, and Sept. 10/11.** Please save these dates if possible. If you have any questions about PADS you can contact any of the following people for more information: Heidi or Dave Loffredo, Jim or Christine Massie, Joe or Joannie Chandler, or Jeanne Widing.

**What PADS is:** PADS stands for “Public Action to Deliver Shelter”. PADS has been in existence for 25 years, providing shelter and support services to homeless or at risk individuals and families in DuPage County. Here are some facts: During the 2009-2010 season, about 1100 men, women, and children were served, including 174 children, 33,100 total nights of shelter were provided, and 109,000 meals were provided. PADS Operates 27 shelter sites which are generally open from October through April, at least one shelter is open May through September.

**CHN’s Role:** The summer host church for PADS is Redeemer Lutheran in Hinsdale (139 E First). The volunteers we need are as follows:

Groceries: done Thursday, Friday or Saturday morning before PADS, dropped at Redeemer.

Cooking - Saturday evening: 4:30-7:30 p.m. (4-5 people)

Setup – Sat evening: 5:30 – 7 p.m. (4-5 people) Set out pads; set up tables, make lunches

Serving/Kitchen Cleanup – Sat evening: 6:30-8:30 p.m. (6-7 people)

Breakfast - Sunday morning: 5:30 -7:30 a.m. (3 people) – Make breakfast, serve, kitchen cleanup

Cleanup - Sunday morning: 6:00-8 a.m. (6 people) – wash pads, take down tables and chairs, vacuum, clean bathrooms, collect laundry

Overnight Supervision: Can be done with 2 people for the entire shift 8 p.m.–5 a.m. or can be broken into smaller shifts (e.g., 8 p.m. -1 a.m., 1– 5 a.m.) Should include 1 man and 1 woman per shift. (NOTE: WE NEED A COUPLE MORE NIGHT VOLUNTEERS)

Laundry: Sheets need to be washed and taken back to CHN or Redeemer by following Friday (4-6 launderers needed)

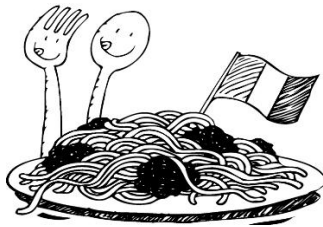
